

MONTHLY ACTIVITY REPORT-NOV 2015

1. Sankalp's efforts were lauded by nationally renowned website The Better India when it interviewed Sankalp President and published an article on its website highlighting the inception and evolution of Sankalp. The story immediately received a nationwide positive response getting 3000+ likes and 500+ shares on its FB Page. Moreover, various organizations like Munirka Inst. and like minded social enthusiasts have mailed our team to understand and cross implement our teaching methodology at their centres.
 - a. Deepti Aggarwal, a humanities graduate wants Sankalp to start such a centre in Poverty stricken Areas of Orissa like Kalahandi and Mayurbhanj.

2. Sankalp's efforts were lauded by nationally renowned website Your Story. Com when it interviewed Sankalp President and published an article on its website highlighting the social impact caused by Sankalp and its vision, efforts and plan

3. Sankalp added another feather to its cap when National Television Channel Zee New approached us for visiting our Jamshedpur based centres and telecasted a live programme on its National Channel and ZEE Regional Channel Purvaiya showing the educational revolution that Sankalp has brought about in tribal areas.
4. Sankalp Team started a stitching cum sewing centre for ladies at Mohan Nagar, Adityapur to better their skills which may add to their family income. The centre will initially train ladies in basics before they churn our products which can be marketed and sold. All necessary items for starting and training sewing classes were bought and handed over to our local volunteer Mr. Nawal.
5. Sankalp Team organized a massive PR-cum awareness session at Rickshaw Basti and Bantanagar, Adityapur and apprise local people about selection process of Navodaya and Netarhat for their children.
6. New centre near MIG Area, Adityapur will be started in January to provide full fledged tuition centres from class 3-9th and prepare students from those selected out of the class for entrance exams of Navodaya, Sainik Schools and other residential cum boarding schools.
7. Updates regarding the progress of MIG Centre:
 - a. Teachers for normal tuition classes and Navodaya classes arranged
 - b. Salary negotiated and frozen for all teachers
 - c. Vivek Sir from California to bear the total expenses of MIG centres both onetime set up cost and running cost.
 - d. Material for Navodaya and Netarhat preparation has already been purchased
8. A second round of Aam Sabha took place to select students and choose the best ones for further training and entrance preparation. It will also focus on RTE, Domestic Violence, and other GOI acts and rules for social welfare.
9. A special team consisting of girls' volunteers has been formed to focus on the growing age issues of all girls in the age group 5-15 enrolled at Sankalp centres. The broad range of issues that would be covered will be:

- a. Negative and positive touch
 - b. Understanding their body when they reach puberty
 - c. Periods (since most of the girls in poor families use cloth and pads are not affordable, they should be taught how to properly use cloth like regular washing drying etc)
 - d. Wearing proper innerwear's for girls reaching puberty
 - e. Self defence
 - f. Not able to communicate their problems to ones parents
 - g. Girls are scared to talk about their personal issues like someone following trying on or getting physical
 - h. Right age to get married or have physical relationships
 - i. There are teachers in school who tries to misuse girls body in many ways which they should learn to identify
 - j. Comfortable and disgusting touch
 - k. Protected sex and about AIDS
 - l. Awareness towards cyber crime and misuse of personal videos and photos
10. The special team would commence its first class in January and record the progress made in behavioural and other areas of girl students
 11. A Special PR session was organized near our Imli Chauk Centre. The area predominantly houses people belonging to minority sections and have extremely poor socio economic indicators. 10 students were selected on the basis of their academic performance to be admitted in private schools in the next academic session.
 12. Bharat Ji. Our coordinator for Imli Chauk centre to arrange a meeting of Sankalp President with local leaders for organizing livelihood programmes thru Self Help groups.
 13. Sankalp brought quality education in the hinterlands of Dhanbad when its centre started functioning with 60 students and 2 permanent teachers. Special credit has to be given to our Dhanbad Volunteers, Mayank, Sanjay and Smriti for taking the initiative and materializing the centre in spite of numerous challenges.
 14. A dedicated team for Navodaya Preparation classes at MIG centre would be formed to take forward this initiative.
 15. Complete database of all students enrolled at Sankalp Centres has been updated in Sankalp Mobi App.
 16. Common tests across all centres to commence from 15th Jan 2016
 17. Sankalp invited winter internships from NIT Jamshedpur students. Pooja Jaiswal and Sujatha Ganga Reddy successfully completed winter training and presented their report-Database of Sankalp children"
 18. Sponsorship Team would now send Sankalp related requests and updates to Alumni in the following order
 - a. Jamshedpur Based Alumni-Tata Steel & Tata Motors
 - b. Current Sponsors of Sankalp children
 - c. All other alumnus
 - d. Target 2k11 batch probable sponsors
 19. First year boys and girls team visited for the first time the nearby Sankalp Centres and got an opportunity to interact with kids and their parents.

20. Groups have been formed from 2nd year volunteers to make a focussed effort on each and every student at Mohan Nagar
21. Regular Tests are being conducted for sponsored children and marks recorded to track their progress and focus on weak areas.
22. Sankalp received accolades form one of the biggest NGOs of the country Teach for India working in the field of education for its stupendous efforts in the Jamshedpur.
23. Sankalp website has been updated with all the latest addition of event details and photographs of the events held in the past few months
24. Drawing competition was held at Imli chauk centre and the best paintings were awarded by the President.
25. Sankalp organized a Joy of Giving Week , a donation event at Mohan Nagar area, Adityapur
 - a. Books, unused and new stationery were distributed to needy children
 - b. Clothes (summer and winter) which were donated by students of NIT Jamshedpur and our well wishers from across the city (Spouses of Tata Steel employees) were distributed to the children and their parents
26. Sankalp received call for stationery and clothes donation from all across the city
27. Sankalp will now focus on learning beyond textbooks to include scientific methods of learning like model making, innovation thru web based projects and IT literacy across all centres. Our MIG centre will be the model centre to start special classes to teach students beyond textbooks and same methods will be deployed across other centres.
28. A special volunteer group of 4-5 students for separate classes of sponsored students with a view to closely monitor and improve their academic performances has been formed both at Mohan Nagar and Hostel A Centre
29. Sankalp Team led by President to arrange for 1 Desktop at each centre starting with Mohan Nagar and NIT Centre. Computer Classes will begin from January 2016
30. Final Tear team to gradually hand over the work to juniors for smooth transition and third year to assume leadership roles by next semester.
31. Sponsorship team has been strengthened by adding new members and assigning roles to individual members.
32. Sankalp Tech Team has now automated the web mailer response system
33. As we now move towards common syllabus, common examination and test patterns, admin panel will soon provide web based access to all centres coordinators
34. Complete database of all students studying at Sankalp Centres across the country will now be made online for generating unique Sankalp ID, entering tests marks and recoding individual child progress
35. Monthly interaction led by President took place with the Teams and special mention was made to the tireless efforts which the volunteers are making for making the different activities successful
36. Both Sankalp-A pledge to change and Sankalp Volunteers group FB page noted huge hike in likes and membership over the month
37. Major decisions taken after the meeting of Office Bearers (President and Secretary)
 - a. Learning Skills development parameters to be evolved to test students progress across all centres
 - b. Filtering of volunteers to be done to take out the non serious ones

- c. As school education & environment can only provide a limited level of socialization for kids coming from slum areas, training them for admission to residential schools like Navodaya and Netarhat would be a priority and focus area for Sankalp
- d. Expansion of centres across the country to continue at optimum pace keeping consistency with resources available
- e. Finance Team to work on documents required for getting 80 G certificate.
